

# KEEP YOUR EYES SAFE AT HOME

Cooking, cleaning, home repair, yard work and even hobbies all pose potential sight-threatening hazards.

Wearing protective eyewear could prevent up to 90% of eye injuries at home. For that reason, we recommend wearing ANSI-approved safety glasses when performing activities such as:

- Mowing and trimming
- Operating power tools
- Using hazardous chemicals and cleaners
- Spreading fertilizer

If you don't require vision correction, or if you wear contact lenses, you can purchase ANSI-approved safety glasses at hardware stores or home improvement centers. For those who require correction, our office can prescribe prescription safety glasses that meet ANSI standards.
